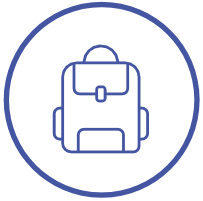


# Accents

From *Wisdom and Eloquence*, Robert Littlejohn and Charles T. Evans

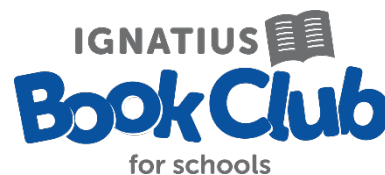
“The liberal arts tradition points us back to truth, goodness, and beauty as foundational values in every person’s education. The physical environments of our schools are a prime opportunity to teach our students that beauty is something that God values and that ought to characterize all of our lives.

Yes, we know, we’ve heard it before, and both authors have said it at some point: ‘But beautiful buildings cost so much more money to build.’ The simple reply is: ‘Then wait until you have more money to build.’ Meanwhile, make sure that the building and classrooms you currently occupy are decorated with reproductions of classic works of art and photographs of beautiful things and places, not just cartoon characters. If walls need to be painted, paint them... There is no excuse for schools that purport to teach the absolute values of truth, goodness, and beauty not to make their students’ surroundings beautiful.”
