CONTINUING PANDEMIC

We have had some students who have been exposed to the Coronavirus outside of school. We are grateful to their parents for having kept them away from the Academy until it was safe for them to return. As a reminder to all families, if your child or anyone in your household is exhibiting symptoms compatible with Coronavirus (fever of 100° or higher, chills, coughing, fatigue, muscle aches or weakness, headache, sore throat, diarrhea, vomiting, new loss of taste, or new loss of smell), ***please keep your child home until testing rules out exposure to Coronavirus and/or your child has been fever-free for 24 consecutive hours.*** If someone in your household tests positive for Coronavirus, please keep your child away from school for fourteen days from the onset of symptoms, by which time it will be certain that he/she has not been infected.

Please use common sense and make decisions that will protect the Academy and allow it to stay open for every student.

planes can lift heavy things up high.


- Third and Fourth graders separated iron particles from breakfast cereal last week and are creating carbon dioxide this week.
