Peace Lutheran Academy has remained very healthy so far this academic year, and we want it to stay that way. Recently, we have encountered a few covid-related situations that have caused us to alter our official policy.

If you suspect that you and/or your child have been exposed to covid, please stay home. If you and/or your child are exhibiting symptoms associated with covid (cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fever or chills, muscle or body aches, vomiting or diarrhea, new loss of taste or smell) please stay home and call your doctor. Then, call the school. Together we will determine the appropriate course of action

- based on your situation, CDC guidelines, and your own physician's recommendation. If you are sick, you should remain in isolation for:
- At least 24 hours after you are free of fever without the use of fever-reducing medication and other symptoms have improved, AND
- At least 10 days after the date you first had symptoms.

We appreciate your patience with the process as we, with Dr. Prowatzke's expertise, navigate our way through this pandemic. Please use common sense and make decisions that will protect the Academy and allow it to stay open for every student.
