RECESS ATTIRE

After discussion among the faculty, we have decided to remove the official policy regarding outdoor attire. Rather than policing hats, gloves, jackets, and boots, we are putting those decisions back into the hands of parents. Every effort will be made to send your child outside for recess in the coats and accessories in which you sent them to us.

We do ask that you continue to send boots if your child wishes to play on the grass. In order to protect your child's shoes as well as the floors and rugs inside the Academy, we will not allow students onto the grass without boots until the ground has sufficiently dried. Students may play on the blacktop without boots.



UNIFORM POLICY

As we near the end of the academic year it is easy for all of us to become complacent about the daily uniforms. As a reminder, all students are required to wear socks or tights with their uniforms, and shirts must have all the buttons attached, including collar buttons.
