END OF THE YEAR

Plans are in the works for a service day at the Mequon Nature Preserve on Monday, May 24. Students in first through seventh grade will be participating. In an effort to reserve their energy for the rest of the week, Kindergarten students will remain at the Academy.

On Tuesday, May 25, all Academy students will be embarking on the all-Academy field trip to the Wisconsin Maritime Museum in Manitowoc.

The students will gather on Wednesday, May 26, at 10:30 am for an all-Academy hymn sing. Parents are welcome to attend, but the students get to choose the hymns. N.B. This is a time change from the May calendar that went home last week.

On Thursday, May 27, the Academy will be breaking from tradition and holding an awards convocation in the place of a banquet. The students will be in class in the morning only. All students, kindergarten included, will be dismissed at 12:00 pm. Lunch will not be provided.

From 6:00-7:00 pm they will return for an open house that will display some of the best of our students' efforts in both academics and arts.

This will be followed by a program at 7:00 pm that will combine class presentations and recognition of excellence, culminating in the annual slide show. We are anticipating that this program, which will be held in the Nave, will be open to all families and friends of Peace Lutheran Academy as well as to prospective families and members of the congregation.

Finally, on Friday, May 28, the students will compete in the annual Catechetical Olympics in the morning. Departing from tradition, they will then go outside for the annual Academy picnic. We are keeping the picnic on campus this year, but the fun, games, and food will be just as delightful as in years past.
