ART NOTES:

Last week, on our normal art day, we were all enjoying turkey leftovers or black Friday shopping, so this week we are catching up with our projects from two weeks ago...almost a lifetime!

Kindergartners are working on their final line drawings of Leo the Lion and starting to practice designs to decorate his body. They are so curious to know what comes next!

First graders are using black crayon to make the final line drawings of their folk art-style fish. They are also practicing various imaginative patterns to fill their fish.

Third and fourth graders completed drawing their tropical birds on construction paper and worked with oil pastels to create color and pattern in the birds. Soon they'll be ready to create a tropical setting in which to place the birds.

The fifth through seventh graders created a leafy tropical background with light pencil and played with placement for their tropical birds. (Using light pencil for drawing the background will allow for erasing lines when birds overlap the vegetation.) In our next lesson, lines will be drawn with permanent marker.

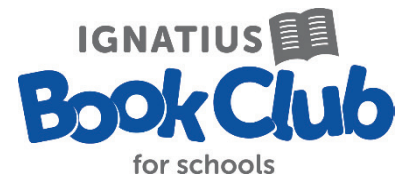
